£25 for entry on the door, but subject to a £5 discount if booked before 30th September, 2008. (No entry on the door after 10:25 am)

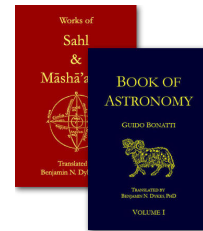

Directions

From the A1(M), take the A52 to Nottingham city centre. Follow signs for the A60 towards Mansfield. The Old Spot Inn is 4 miles from the city centre on the A60. It is a striking yellow building, situated next to the Premier Inn Hotel. (Economical room rates are available at the hotel for anyone needing overnight accommodation). **FREE PARKING** is available in The Old Spot car park.

Travelling from the M1, exit at junction 26 and take the A610 towards Nottingham. Left onto the A6514 Weston Boulevard. Follow this road until the junction with the A60. Turn left towards Mansfield and the hotel is ¼ of a mile up the road on the left hand side.

Public transport is well catered for on this main road into Nottingham.
